CONCEPT NOTE

The North Eastern Region occupies a very crucial position due to its unique and diverse socio-cultural composition, long history of peoples' movements, conflicts, sensitive geo-strategic location and abundant, yet untapped natural resources. Northeast India is an extremely diverse region in terms of race, ethnic groups, language, religion, culture and tradition. Far more important is the strategic location of the region, sharing international borders with Bangladesh, Bhutan, China, Myanmar and Nepal. In fact, Northeast India is the confluence of South Asia, South East Asia and East Asia. Apart from the physical and geographical linkages, the communities in North East India have cultural and civilizational linkages with the people of South East Asia and East Asia.

The introduction and advancement of technology in these tribal societies have created a huge gap leading to alienation, frustration and distress among the youths due to unemployment, widening Class gap, heavy urban migration and other related problems. Different schemes and policies initiated to develop the region have not produced the desired outcome. Other issues such as 'struggle' for 'independence', autonomy movements, contest over natural resources, migration related issues, conflict induced displacement and environment induced displacement, etc., deserve an in-depth analysis, better understanding and a re-orientation of policies. The proposed two day national seminar intends to deliberate and bring out fresh insights on the current issues pertaining to North East India.
